African-American Studies	188A	Special Courses	Investigation of minstrelsy phenomenon. Using advertisements, film, sitcoms, television news, music, and other media forms, students interrogate processes and relationships between media/cultural production of ethnic and racial identities through use of minstrelsy and ways in which minstrelsy has been appropriated and commodified. In other words, how have consumers of mass media been bamboozled into re-invention of minstrelsy and/or blackface in way that is deemed acceptable? Discussion of how cultural production of minstrelsy attempts to shape our worldview. Chicana & Chicano Studies	180	Chicanas/Chicano Studies: Schools and Community Activism	This course presents an overview of Chicana/o educational issues in the United States. Special emphasis will be placed on several important historical events that exemplify the struggle for educational justice and equity that affected Chicana/o education: the Mendez v. Environment	M132	Environmentalism: Past, Present, and Future	Exploration of history and origin of major environmental ideas, movements or counter-movements they spawned, and new and changing nature of modern environmentalism. Introduction to early ideas of environment, how rise of modern sciences reshaped environmental thought, and how this was later transformed by 19th-century ideas and rise of American conservation movements. Review of politics of American environmental thought and contemporary environmental questions as they relate to broader set of questions about nature of development, sustainability, and equity in environmental debate. Law	182	Law and Popular Culture	Focus on interface between two important subjects -- law and popular culture. Students view series of films or television shows related to law, lawyers, and legal system. Discussion of pop culture treatment of subjects such as adversary system, good and bad lawyers, female lawyers, lawyers from lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender community, minority lawyers, work life of lawyers, legal education, ethical issues, jury system, and criminal and civil justice, drawing on film theory and filmmaking technique to deepen understanding of interrelationship between law and popular culture. Global Health	100	Global Health and Development	Interdisciplinary examination of key issues in area of global health, with focus on developing world. Provides basis for understanding current debates that frame global health problems and actions in and across nations with strikingly different political-economic contexts.
