Graduate Mentor – McNair Research Scholars Program

Graduate Research Mentor Position – Summer 2022

The UCLA McNair Research Scholars Program helps first-generation, low-income, and underrepresented students identify and apply to graduate school programs, conduct independent research projects, and prepare for graduate school entrance exams. McNair GSR/Mentors lead virtual seminars, conduct virtual workshops, and hold individual virtual mentoring appointments.

McNair Mentors meet in-person with McNair students to discuss research agendas and the graduate school application process including: researching and choosing graduate programs, preparing personal statements and statements of purpose, obtaining letters of recommendation, and funding. Mentors also assist McNair students in developing their research proposal, literature review, and senior thesis. This program runs Summer Session A (June 21st, 2022 July 29th, 2022). Mentors are appointed beginning June 13th - July 30th, 2022. Training will be held June 13th - 15th, 2022.

Job Responsibilities:

- ♦ Facilitating group mentoring of McNair students seeking to pursue graduate school
- ♦ Individual mentoring appointments with McNair students and undergraduate students involved in or seeking to become involved in undergraduate research
- Outreach to academic departments, faculty, other AAP and Division of Undergraduate Education units, and the Graduate Division on behalf of the McNair Program
- Organize faculty, guest speakers, and student roundtables in various academic disciplines
- ♦ Assist in the continued development of McNair
- Prepare students for presenting their research and assisting with the UCLA National McNair Research Conference

Eligibility Criteria:

- Currently enrolled UCLA graduate student during the time of appointment with a minimum GPA of 3.0, making normal progress towards the graduate degree as outlined by Graduate Division and departmental guidelines
- ♦ Demonstrated commitment to equity, diversity, and inclusion
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills
- ♦ Interest in working with and assisting McNair students and alumni who are interested in research and pursuing degrees in the humanities, arts, social sciences, life sciences, and physical sciences
- ♦ Interest in working with low-income, first-generation college students
- ♦ Able to work 20 hours per week 50% appointment

Compensation and Title:

Hourly rates: \$21.70 for individual tutoring/mentoring; \$26.70 for group tutoring/mentoring



Application Process:

Priority deadline is April 8th at 5pm and applications will be reviewed thereafter as needed. A completed application packet will include:

- A cover letter stating how you meet the criteria and how you would contribute to strengthening McNair
- ♦ An unofficial copy of your most recent graduate transcript
- ♦ CV
- Statement of teaching philosophy
- ♦ Evaluations from students, if available
